# The Wright Angle

Greetings Church Family,

I once "Googled" the question, "Is the universe perfect?" and below is what I found. Although I don't fully understand it, I find it intriguing. I believe it leads to an important conversation, so keep reading; perhaps more than just a cosmic question will be answered. Is the universe perfect?

"The universe is asymmetrical. There is no perfect balance of physical forces throughout it. In the beginning, matter and antimatter (atomic particles with opposite electrical charges and spins) are thought to have existed in almost equal amounts. The

key word here is 'almost'; if the quantities had been truly equal, matter as we know it could not have formed, as opposing particles would have annihilated each other, leaving nothing but gamma rays. Fortunately, enough matter remained to allow the physical universe to form. Other opposing forces are also unequal, such as the expansion of the universe versus total gravity. It turns out that gravity is greatly insufficient to have any effect there. It may be that the universe's imperfections are what allow it to exist."

I love that last line: "Imperfection is what allows the universe to be!" The parallel is clear: imperfection is what allows the church to be what it is meant to be. Jesus once responded to the 'perfect' Pharisees who accused Him of being a friend to sinners: "It is not those who are well who need a physician, but those who are sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance."

If we've read the Bible, we know that the Pharisees themselves were also sinners. In fact, Christ came to save all people because all are sick, broken, and sinful. He has called this collection of out-of-balance folks (humanity) to be the church. Like the universe, imperfection could be what allows the church to exist.

Like it or not, in the church, we are all in the process of smoothing out each other's rough edges. It is said that iron sharpens iron. In community, our humanity surfaces, and that is precisely where the Spirit of Christ begins to work on our hearts, transforming us from something broken into something beautiful. Isn't that wonderful? We are growing up in Christ and becoming more whole. Striving for perfection won't get us there; in fact, it may turn us into Pharisees. Instead, we should strive to be healed, whole, and good. This is what moves us in the right direction. Seeking wholeness means regularly confessing that we are not enough, that we have cracks, and that we need one another.
